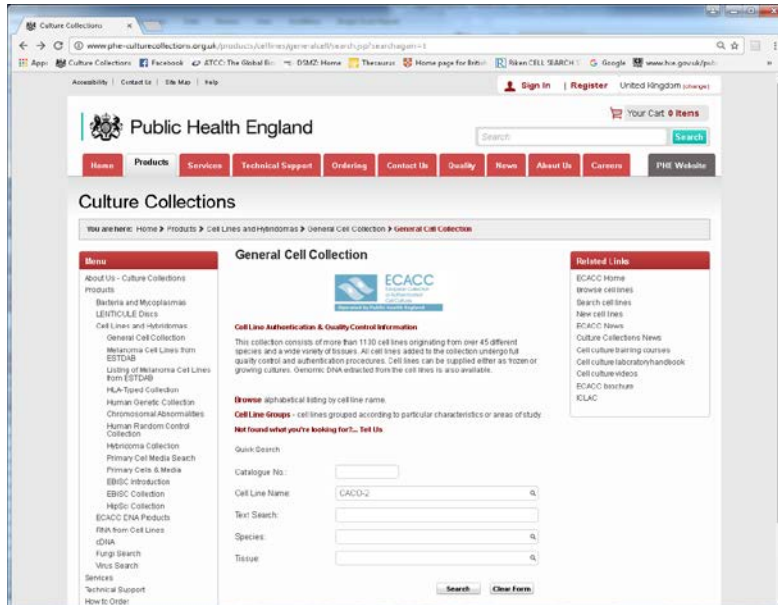
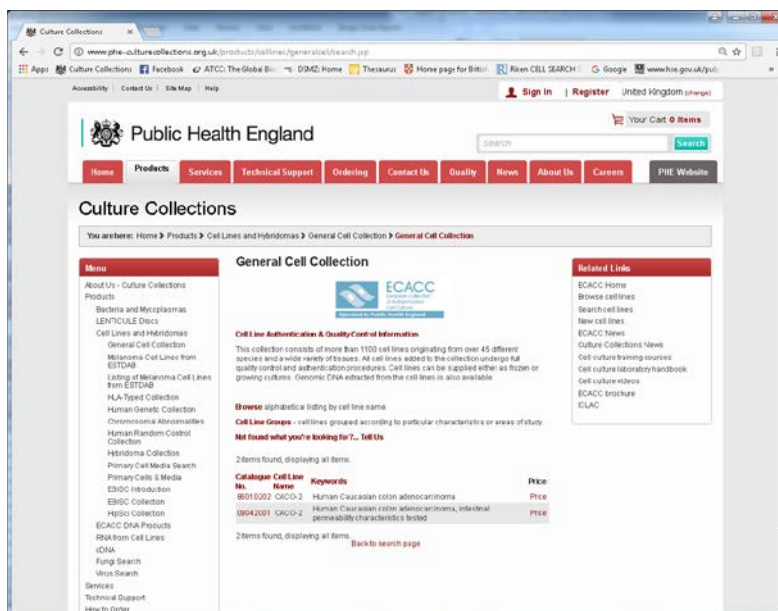


How to search for an ECACC Certificate of Analysis

- use the Culture Collections website General Cell Collection catalogue search page www.phe-culturecollections.org.uk/products/celllines/generalcell/search to search for the cell line.



- open the catalogue entry by clicking on the link attached to the 8 digit catalogue number




How to search for an ECACC Certificate of Analysis

- click on the Certificates of Analysis (CoA) icon situated in the box on the right hand side of the catalogue entry



- enter the lot number into the search field for the format of the cells received (usually frozen) and click search

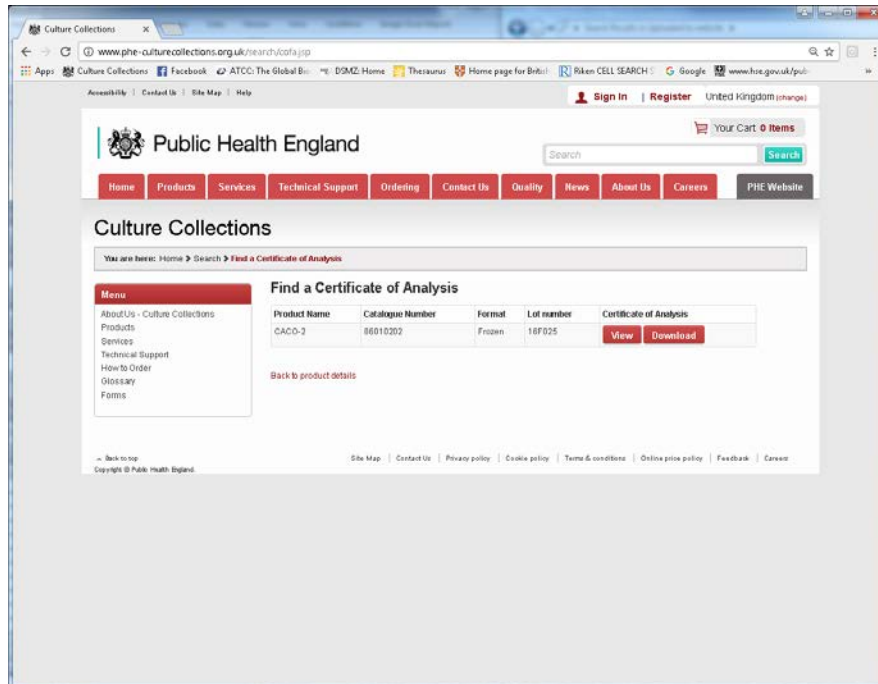
